

CHAPTER 86

AN ACT

Relating to the employment of noncitizens by the state.

(H.B. 124)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 39.05.010 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

Sec. 39.05.010. **Employment of Persons Not Citizens Prohibited.** It is unlawful for the state or for a city or organized borough in the state to employ a person who is not a citizen of the United States

if there is a citizen of the United States possessing equal ability, training, and competence available. The determination of availability, ability, training, and competence shall be made by the governing body of the municipality involved or the director of personnel, Department of Administration. This section does not nullify AS 08.64.200 or 08.64.370.

CHAPTER 87

AN ACT

Relating to illegal use of telephones.

(H.B. 134)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 11.45 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 11.45.035. **Illegal Use of Telephones.** A person who anonymously telephones another person repeatedly for

the purpose of annoying, molesting, abusing, through vile and obscene language, or harassing that person or his family, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction is punishable by imprisonment in jail for not less than three months nor more than one year, or by a fine of not less than \$1,000, or by both.

CHAPTER 88

AN ACT

To exclude subsistence payments from taxable wages under the Alaska Employment Security Act.

(H.B. 137)

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 23.20.530(b) is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

(10) the amount of a payment made to or on behalf of an employee

for subsistence while he is employed away from home, but this exemption applies only to that portion of a subsistence payment which does not exceed the actual expenses of the employee while so employed.
