HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 37

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Requesting the designation of
Captain Cook State Park.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the State of Alaska has selected 5,120 acres at Point Possession on Cook Inlet and the selection is now awaiting approval of the Department of the Interior; and

WHEREAS the Cook Inlet Historical Society and others have asked that the site be used for a state park to be known as the Captain Cook State Park; and

WHEREAS the official designation of the park must await federal approval of the land selection and some preliminary planning;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is respectfully requested to direct the Division of Lands, Department of Natural Resources, to take the necessary action as soon as feasible to see that the necessary surveys and planning are accomplished preparatory to submitting legislation to the Legislature in January 1967 officially designating the acreage set aside at Point Possession as the Captain Cook State Park.
