HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 49

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Directing the Legislative Council  
to study and report on a records  
management system for the state.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the effectiveness of government is conditioned to a great extent on the development, storage, use, accessibility and disposal of its records; and

WHEREAS a proper system of records management is essential to the interests of all persons having dealings with the government to protect their rights and to transact business; and

WHEREAS the development and maintenance of essential records and the disposal of records no longer needed involves considerable expense to the state government; and

WHEREAS the Legislature is vitally interested in the development, maintenance, storage and disposition of state records as essential functions of government;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council is directed to make a survey of record management practices in the state including the use of microfilming, review management systems of other states, and report its findings with recommendations to the Fifth Legislature in 1967 regarding a possible uniform system of records management for the state.
