HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 54

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Directing a study of motor
vehicle safety inspection laws.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Alaska does not have a compulsory motor vehicle inspection law; and

WHEREAS 20 states now have a compulsory motor vehicle inspection law and the President's Committee for Traffic Safety reports that such laws result in the discovery of many defective vehicles and prohibits their being operated on the highways; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Safety Council established in 1965 has suggested the need for a study of other motor vehicle inspection laws, including laws relating to the use of motorized ski equipment, and a determination as to their effectiveness and the possible need for them in Alaska;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council is directed to make an interim study on motor vehicle safety inspection laws used in other states and to report its findings and recommendations to the Fifth Legislature in January of 1967.
