SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 14

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Supporting an effort to improve the status of the Department of State office dealing with international fishery problems.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS there is an increasing need to strengthen the United States position in the field of international fisheries; and

WHEREAS the United States fishery problems on the high seas are becoming more numerous as our coastal and distant waters fisheries develop and expand; and

WHEREAS the present status of the Office of the Special Assistant to the Under Secretary of State is not adequate to meet the international fishery problems of the future; and

WHEREAS a meeting has been called by U. S. Senators E. L. Bartlett and Warren G. Magnuson between the Secretary of State and Congressional and industry representatives interested in the United States fisheries, to review the problem;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of the State of Alaska expresses support for strengthening the Office of the Special Assistant to the Under Secretary of State and wishes every success for the Congressional meeting with the Secretary of State and industry representatives to resolve the problem.
