SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 20

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FOURTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Requesting a study as to the
feasibility of constructing
dormitories at Valdez, Nenana,
Dillingham and King Salmon.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS there are many children who are eligible to attend high school but who have no school facilities available to them; and

WHEREAS construction of school facilities at the home towns of these children is not economically or educationally sound; and

WHEREAS there are existing school facilities which could offer educational services to these children if boarding facilities were available; and

WHEREAS Valdez, Nenana, Dillingham and King Salmon appear to have the necessary school facilities and are so centrally located that if dormitory facilities are constructed, many children presently denied educational services could be provided the training to which they are entitled;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to direct the Department of Education to study the feasibility of constructing dormitories and other boarding facilities at Valdez, Nenana, Dillingham and King Salmon and to submit a report of the study to the Legislature by January 1967.
