AN ACT

Relating to the issuance of certain alcoholic beverage licenses; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 04.15.020(e) is amended to read:

(e) Churches and schools. The board shall not issue a beverage dispensary license or package liquor store license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in any building in which the public entrance is within 200 feet of a school ground or church building measured by the shortest pedestrian route from the outer boundaries of the school ground or public entrance of a church building in which religious services are conducted, within or outside any corporate municipality nor for use within one mile of a state-owned college or university where dormitories are provided. This distance shall be measured in a straight line from the central administrative building of the college or university. A license may be reissued or transferred from one licensee to another, for the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building in which that sale was authorized by law on April 25, 1960. When a license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building within 200 feet of a school ground or church building in which religious services are conducted is forfeited, lapses or is transferred to other premises, no license for the sale of intoxicating liquor at the prior licensed location shall thereafter be issued. However, the location may be relicensed in the event of the removal of either cause of the restriction.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
