AN ACT

Relating to the sale of land to shore fisheries.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 38.05 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 38.05.066. PREFERENCE TO PERSONS FOR FISHERY PURPOSES. When, in the judgment of the director with the concurrence of the commissioner, it is determined that it would be in the best interests of the state and reasonably necessary for the use and enjoyment of a shore fishery lease, the director may sell an uplands tract of land not to exceed five acres in size to the fishery lessee. The price of the land shall be determined by the director based on the fair market value of the tract at the time of the transaction. In order for a shore fishery lessee to be eligible to purchase under this section, he must be presently in actual or constructive occupancy of a site which was originally sanctioned by a small tracts lease from the federal government which has since been transferred to the jurisdiction of the state.
