AN ACT

Relating to guide dogs for the blind.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 11.70 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 11.70.040. BLIND PERSONS WITH GUIDE DOGS IN PUBLIC PLACES. (a) A blind person who is a passenger on a common carrier, airplane, motor vehicle, railroad train, motor bus, streetcar, boat, or any other public conveyance or mode of transportation operating within the state, shall be entitled to have with him a guide dog specially trained for that purpose, without being required to pay an additional charge.

(b) A blind person and his guide dog shall not be denied admittance to a hotel, motel, public inn, public cafe, public elevator, or any other similar place in the state providing the guide dog is loosely muzzled. A blind person shall not be required to pay additional charges for his guide dog, but shall be liable for damage done to the premises and individuals by his dog.

(c) A person, firm, association, or corporation, or the agent of a person, firm, association, or corporation, who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.
