HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 3

Relating to the preservation and restoration of Alaska's vanishing historical sites and objects.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

WHEREAS the tourists who come to Alaska are always extremely interested in the colorful and exciting history of the state; and

WHEREAS the year 1967 is the Centennial Year for the State of Alaska and a time when an exceptionally large number of tourists will be visiting the state; and

WHEREAS Alaska has not had an active program to preserve and restore its many famous historical sites and objects thereby allowing many of the great monuments and landmarks of Alaska's past to disappear or fall into a condition of deterioration and neglect;

BE IT RESOLVED that the governor is respectfully requested to direct the Alaska State Council on the Arts to establish and carry out an active and continuing program to preserve and restore the vanishing historical sites and objects in Alaska and to recommend to the Second Session of the Fifth State Legislature legislation, if any, necessary to assure the success of such a program.
