JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to making it mandatory that all aircraft manufacturers report aircraft and engine discrepancies and malfunctions to the Maintenance Analysis Center in Oklahoma City.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the enormous size of the state makes it necessary that the people of Alaska depend to a great extent on aircraft as a mode of transportation; and

WHEREAS, because of this great dependence on aircraft, it is particularly important to the citizens of Alaska that air travel be made as safe as possible; and

WHEREAS, to insure the safety of all persons flying, it is vitally important that all aircraft be kept in the finest operating condition and that aircraft and engine discrepancies and malfunctions be immediately noted and alleviated;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fifth Legislature of the State of Alaska respectfully requests the Federal Aviation Agency to make it mandatory that all aircraft manufacturers report aircraft and engine discrepancies and malfunctions to the Maintenance Analysis Center in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.
