AN ACT

Relating to state employees' military leaves of absence; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 39.20.340 is amended to read:

Sec. 39.20.340. LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR RESERVE MEMBERS OF ARMED FORCES. (a) An employee of the state, or a political subdivision, with the approval of the city council or borough assembly, who is a member of a reserve component of the United States Armed Forces is entitled to a leave of absence without loss of pay, time, or efficiency rating on all days during which he is ordered to training duty, as distinguished from active duty, with troops or at field exercises, or for instruction. The leave of absence may not exceed 16 1/2 working days in any one calendar year.

(b) If an employee is called to active duty by the governor, an employee otherwise qualified in (a) of this section is entitled to five days leave of absence without loss of pay, time, or efficiency rating.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1970.
