AN ACT

Relating to liquor licenses; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 04.10.130 is amended to read:

Sec. 04.10.130. COMMON CARRIER DISPENSARY LICENSE. The holder of a common carrier dispensary license may sell intoxicating liquors for consumption aboard a boat, an aircraft, or a railroad buffet car licensed for passenger travel while in transit only; provided a holder of a common carrier dispensary license may sell intoxicating liquor for consumption aboard such common carrier while stationary if not prohibited by local ordinance. No common carrier dispensary license may be issued for any boat or vessel of less than 25 gross tons, United States Custom House measurement. The common carrier dispensary license fee is \$250 for each vessel, aircraft or buffet car.

* Sec. 2. AS 04.10.400 is amended to read:

Sec. 04.10.400. INCREASE IN NUMBER OF LICENSES BY CITY COUNCIL OR BOROUGH ASSEMBLY. The city council of an incorporated town or the assembly of an organized borough, may with the approval of the board increase by ordinance the number of licenses authorized under secs. 210 - 290 of this chapter.

* Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
