## AN ACT

Changing the dates of certain legal holidays; and providing for an effective date.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 44.12.010 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

Sec. 44.12.010. LEGAL HOLIDAYS. The following days are legal holidays: (1) the first of January, known as New Year's Day; (2) the 12th of February, known as Lincoln's Birthday; (3) the third Monday in February, known as Washington's Birthday; (4) the last Monday of March, known as Seward's Day; (5) the last Monday in May, known as Memorial Day; (6) the fourth of July, known as Independence Day; (7) the first Monday in September, known as Labor Day; (8) the third Monday of October, known as Alaska Day; (9) the fourth Monday in October, known as Veterans' Day; (10) the fourth Thursday in November, known as Thanksgiving Day; (11) the 25th of December, known as Christmas Day; (12) every Sunday; (13) every day designated by public proclamation by the President of the United States or the governor of the state as a legal holiday.

\* Sec. 2. AS 44.12.020 is amended to read:

Sec. 44.12.020. HOLIDAY FALLING ON SUNDAY. If a holiday listed in sec. 10 of this chapter, except sec. 10 (12), falls on a Sunday, Sunday and the following Monday are both legal holidays.

\* Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on January 1, 1970.
