AN ACT

Relating to licenses by endorsement and temporary permits for nurses; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 08.68.200 is amended to read:

Sec. 08.68.200. LICENSE BY ENDORSEMENT. The board may issue a license by endorsement to practice professional nursing or to practice practical nursing, whichever is appropriate, to an applicant who is licensed as either a professional nurse or a practical nurse under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country, if in the opinion of the board the applicant meets the qualifications required for licensing in the state, and meets the requirements of either sec. 170 or sec. 180 of this chapter, whichever is applicable.

* Sec. 2. AS 08.68.210 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

Sec. 08.68.210. TEMPORARY PERMITS. (a) The board may issue a temporary permit, nonrenewable and valid for a period not exceeding four months, to an applicant for a license by endorsement if he

(1) submits proof satisfactory to the board that he is currently licensed in another state, territory, or foreign country,

(2) meets the requirements of either sec. 170 or sec. 180 of this chapter, whichever is applicable, and

(3) pays the required fee.

(b) The board may issue a nonrenewable permit to an applicant for license by examination if he meets the

qualifications of sec. 170 or sec. 180 of this chapter, whichever is applicable, and pays the required fee. The permit will be valid for a period not extending beyond the time when the results are published of the first examination the applicant is eligible to take after the permit is issued.

(C) license by endorsement fee..... \$20

* Sec. 4. AS 08.68.220(2)(C) is amended to read:

(C) license by endorsement fee..... \$15

* Sec. 5. AS 08.68.410 is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

(8) "endorsement" is the licensing or registering of an applicant without examination through the acceptance of a license or registration issued by any state, territory, or foreign country after a comprehensive examination which is equivalent to the examination offered in this state, and providing the applicant meets all other qualifications as required by law.

* Sec. 6. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
