## JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to an air route between Fairbanks, Juneau, Minneapolis-St. Paul, and Chicago.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS air transportation has always been vital to the people and economy of Alaska; and

WHEREAS tourist and business travel between Alaska and the other states is increasing at a tremendous rate; and

WHEREAS at present there is a severely limited number of air routes between Alaska and the other states; and

WHEREAS by Presidential Proclamation there was established the Discover America Program to promote travel within the United States;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Civil Aeronautics Board is urged to grant an exemption or schedule an expeditious hearing on Wien Consolidated Airlines' proposed route between Fairbanks, Juneau, Minneapolis-St. Paul, and Chicago at the earliest possible date in order that the people in these areas will be provided a needed service.

Ogilvie, Governor of Illinois; and the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Mike Gravel, U. S. Senators, and the Honorable Howard W. Pollock, U. S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
