HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 13

Encouraging the Alaska State Housing Authority to continue to provide low-cost housing in rural Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

WHEREAS one of the most pressing problems in Alaska today is the lack of adequate rural housing; and

WHEREAS it is recognized that some 8,000 housing units must be built or replaced annually in Alaska over the next five years; and

WHEREAS future housing construction needs cannot be met unless the state takes immediate steps to provide incentives and assistance to all segments of the home building industry in Alaska; and

WHEREAS in the area of providing rural housing the Alaska State Housing Authority has been taking an active and progressive part in recent years; and

WHEREAS, because of the overwhelming need for low-cost housing in the state, the Alaska State Housing Authority should be encouraged to take an even greater part in the future to utilize all available housing funds and programs;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Housing Authority is respectfully requested to not only continue but to increase its activities in the field of providing low-cost housing in rural Alaska.
