SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2

Honoring the late Senator E. L. "Bob" Bartlett.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS on December 11, 1968, the State of Alaska and its people suffered a profound loss by the death of Bob Bartlett; and

WHEREAS Bob Bartlett was a native Alaskan, born of pioneer parents, who spent more than three decades in service to Alaska and the nation; and

WHEREAS during his 22 years in Washington as a delegate to Congress and as a United States Senator, he served on most of the important congressional committees, introduced and was instrumental in the passage of countless pieces of legislation important to the growth and well-being of Alaska, and contributed as much, or more, than any other single individual to statehood; and

WHEREAS he was known and loved throughout the state as a devoted, compassionate and principled man, symbolizing that which is finest in public service; and

WHEREAS he was respected by his congressional colleagues as a man of highest stature and integrity, vitally interested in the welfare of his home state and its native population; and

WHEREAS he will be remembered by the people of this country as a dedicated conservationist, protector of the consumer, and enemy of demagoguery;

~~BE IT RESOLVED~~ that the members of the Sixth State Legislature extend their most sincere expressions of regard and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the department report its findings and recommendations, within 30 days after the passage of this Resolution, to the House of Representatives or to the Legislative Council if the First Session of the Sixth Legislature has adjourned.
