## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7

Requesting a study of the employment of Alaskan natives.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the employment of Alaskan natives is of vital concern to the state; and

WHEREAS, despite this concern, the employment of Alaskan natives remains too low, due to various sociological and educational factors, as well as administrative regulations, personnel rules, and statutes which impose unrealistic requirements or otherwise deter full employment;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to direct the Commission for Human Rights to conduct a study of the state's practices, procedures and law relating to the hiring of Alaskan natives, the study to include consideration of available training programs and the efforts, if any, that are being made to increase the employability of Alaskan natives; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission shall also determine what administrative regulations, personnel rules, and statutes may be unrealistic or otherwise deter full employment, and shall make a report to the Second Session of the Sixth State Legislature, which report shall include recommendations for changes in the regulations, rules and statutes, if changes are found to be desirable in order to increase this employability.
