JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to establishing a natural gas supply for Wainwright, Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA :

WHEREAS the United States Navy gas reserves on the area around Barrow and Wainwright, Alaska represent one of the only available supplies of fuel for the surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS the Navy is presently contemplating the sinking of new wells in this reserve to increase the present available fuel supply; and

WHEREAS the lack of a ready fuel supply has greatly burdened the personal lives of the inhabitants of Wainwright, Alaska and held back the economic growth of this community to a mere trickle; and

WHEREAS the presence of a fuel supply to the village of Wainwright would alleviate the suffering of its 400 inhabitants;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature urgently requests the Secretary of the Navy to investigate the possibility of locating a well near enough to the village of Wainwright, Alaska to permit utilization of this natural gas supply; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior study the feasibility of transmission and distribution of this natural gas supply to the villagers of Wainwright, Alaska and make available appropriate federal funds to carry this study to fruition.
