AN ACT

Relating to teacher's retirement survivor's allowance.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 14.25.162(a) is amended to read:

(a) If a teacher dies while in membership service or while receiving a disability retirement salary or after normal retirement and leaves a minor child, his surviving spouse is entitled to a survivor's allowance provided the teacher has made a supplemental contribution for at least one year before his death, but if a guardian has been appointed for a minor child, the guardian is entitled to the allowance. A minor child who has neither a surviving parent nor a guardian is entitled to the allowance. If a minor child who is at least 19 years old but less than 23 years old is out of school for more than one semester, payments of his benefits shall terminate permanently. A teacher's child who is totally and permanently disabled before he is 19 years old or, if he is attending school and becomes totally and permanently disabled before he is 23 years old, and who is financially dependent on the teacher at the time of the teacher's death is entitled to the benefits under this section until he dies or is no longer totally and permanently disabled. Application for the survivor's allowance shall be made in writing to the administrator.
