AN ACT

Relating to public education; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 14.03.080(a) is amended to read:

(a) A child of school age is entitled to attend public school without payment of tuition during the school term in the school district in which he is a resident subject to the provisions of AS 14.14.110 and AS 14.14.120.

* Sec. 2. AS 14.14.110 is amended to read:

Sec. 14.14.110. COOPERATION WITH OTHER DISTRICTS. When necessary to provide more efficient or more economical educational services, a district may cooperate or the department may require a district to cooperate with other districts, state-operated schools, or the Bureau of Indian Affairs in providing educational services or in establishing boarding and tuition arrangements, arrangements for the exchange of pupils or teachers, or other similar arrangements. However, if a cooperative arrangement requires pupils to live away from their usual homes, the school board shall provide classes within the attendance area when there are at least eight children eligible to attend elementary and secondary school in the attendance area.

* Sec. 3. AS 14.60.010 is amended by adding a new section to read:

(9) "attendance area" means the geographic area designated by the department to be served by a school.

* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect July 1, 1972.
