HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 24

Relating to a study of the Uniform Probate Code.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, due to expression of concern by the Alaska Bar Association and individual members of the Alaska Bar for several years, the legislature passed 1960 House Concurrent Resolution No. 57, requesting the Legislative Council to prepare a revised probate code; and

WHEREAS that revision has been repeatedly introduced in the legislature since 1961, it being House Bill No. 5 in the current legislature; and

WHEREAS the Uniform Probate Code, approved by the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws and the American Bar Association in August 1969, appears to be a more satisfactory alternative to our present law than does House Bill No. 5; and

WHEREAS the time remaining in this First Session of the Seventh State Legislature is insufficient to study the matter properly;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council is requested to study the Uniform Probate Code, comparing it to our present law and to House Bill No. 5; conduct public hearings on the probate code in appropriate locations in the state; solicit analysis and comment from the bar associations in the state; and prepare a report and substitute bill for presentation to the Second Session of the Seventh State Legislature.
