SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 10

Honoring Ralph Eugene Kvalvik.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS Ralph Eugene Kvalvik, one of Alaska's outstanding professional guides, met an untimely death in March of this year; and

WHEREAS, after coming to Alaska in 1962, Eugene Kvalvik became a registered guide in 1964 and served with distinction in his chosen profession; and

WHEREAS he was a member of the board of directors of the Alaska Professional Hunter's Association; and

WHEREAS Eugene Kvalvik demonstrated his concern and love for Alaska's natural resource heritage through his active participation in the Sierra Club and the Alaska Conservation Society; and

WHEREAS as a writer and frequent contributor to national sporting publications, including "Outdoor Life", he was instrumental in pointing out many of the hunting and guiding abuses within Alaska to the betterment of all the people of the state;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Senate expresses its most sincere condolences to the family of Ralph Eugene Kvalvik and that this resolution serve as an expression of the high regard and esteem that his innumerable friends in the state had for him.
