## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 32

Relating to the banning of certain imported fish.

\*\*\*\*\*

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS information has become available indicating that Japanese fishermen have taken substantial amounts of halibut from the Bering Sea east of the abstention line set up by the International North Pacific Fisheries Convention with trawling gear in areas designated for hook and line fishing only; and

WHEREAS the information also indicates that the Japanese have fished this area throughout the year when the area was officially open for halibut fishing only 21 days; and

WHEREAS imports of halibut filets from the Japanese indicate that the size of the fish being taken by the Japanese is also in violation of the International North Pacific Fisheries Convention; and

WHEREAS the Fishermen's Protective Act of 1967 states that the Secretary of Commerce shall certify facts to the President if foreign fishermen are conducting fishing operations in a manner or under circumstances which diminish the effectiveness of an international fishery conservation program; and

WHEREAS the President may direct the Secretary of the Treasury to prohibit the bringing or the importation into the United States of fish products of an offending country for a period of time as he determines is appropriate;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska Legislature that the Secretary of Commerce is urgently requested to certify to the President

the facts surrounding the halibut fishing by the Japanese; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the President is respectfully requested to take decisive and immediate action by directing the Secretary of the Treasury to ban the importation of Japanese halibut until such time as assurances are forthcoming that the International North Pacific Fisheries Convention will be strictly adhered to.

Senators, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
