SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 33

Commending Colonel James Carter.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Colonel James Carter, one of the 50 charter members of the Civil Air Patrol in Alaska 24 years ago, recently retired; and

WHEREAS Colonel Carter helped the organization struggle through its infancy and for the past 14 years has served as commander of the Alaska Wing; and

WHEREAS during his many years of service with the Alaska Wing the organization has been credited with saving hundreds of lives and of spending thousands of hours in other rescue or search missions; and

WHEREAS Colonel Carter, in recognition of his services, has been awarded the United States Air Force Exceptional Service Award, the highest award that a civilian can receive; and

WHEREAS through his leadership the Alaska Wing greatly expanded its numbers and abilities and gained numerous state and national honors;
