Relating to fishing and hunting licenses, big game tags, and fishing permits; and providing for an effective date.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

\* Section 1. AS 16.05.340(a)(6) is amended to read:

(6) Visitor's special sport fishing license -- valid for the  
period inscribed on the license

- (A) For 14-day [10-DAY] license..... \$20 [\$15]
- (B) For three-day [ONE-DAY] license..... 10 [5]

\* Sec. 2. AS 16.05.340(a)(7) is amended to read:

(7) Nonresident sport fishing license..... 36 [30]

\* Sec. 3. AS 16.05.340(a)(9) is amended to read:

(9) Nonresident hunting and sport fishing  
license..... 96 [90]

A nonresident may not take a big game animal without previously pur-  
chasing a numbered, nontransferable, appropriate tag, issued to him as  
provided in (16) of this subsection. The tag shall be affixed to the  
animal immediately upon capture and shall remain affixed until the  
animal is prepared for storage, consumed, or exported. A tag issued  
but not used for an animal may be used to satisfy the tagging require-  
ment for any other animal of the species named for which the tag fee is  
of equal or less value.

21 for resident hunting and sport fishing licenses, but may not take a big  
22 game animal without previously purchasing a regular nonresident hunting  
23 license and a numbered, nontransferable appropriate tag, issued at  
24 one-half of the nonresident rate, under (a)(16) of this section.
