## AN ACT

Relating to vocational rehabilitation programs providing for the operation of vending facilities on public property.

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**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

AN ACT

Relating to vocational rehabilitation programs providing  
for the operation of vending facilities on public pro-  
perty.

\* Section 1. AS 23.15.100(a) is amended by adding new paragraphs to read:

(5) survey the potential for providing vending facilities on public property and, when feasible, establish vending facilities operated by blind persons and severely handicapped persons on public property;

(6) license blind persons and severely handicapped persons in accordance with AS 23.15.133 for the operation of vending facilities on public property, with blind persons having first priority for operation of the vending facilities;

(7) provide the training and supervision necessary to enable blind persons and severely handicapped persons to operate vending facilities;

(8) provide the equipment and initial stock necessary to enable blind persons and severely handicapped persons to operate vending facilities.

(b) Receipts from the net proceeds of vending facilities on [IN] public property [BUILDINGS], other than vending facilities operated by a licensee, shall be paid into [TO] the fund.

Sec. 23.15.132. VENDING FACILITIES. (a) A vending facility may

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1 not be established on public property that is under the jurisdiction of  
2 the state except as authorized by the commissioner of education.

3 (b) A vending facility authorized by the commissioner of education  
4 shall be selected and located after consulting with the persons respons-  
5 ible for the maintenance and operation of the property to be served by  
6 the vending facility. A contract for the operation of the vending  
7 facility by a licensee shall be executed by the agency and shall contain  
8 provisions insuring that the licensee shall charge reasonable prices and  
9 that the vending facility shall provide high quality merchandise.

10 Sec. 23.15.133. VENDORS' LICENSES. (a) The agency shall issue a  
11 license for the operation of a vending facility on public property to a  
12 blind person or severely handicapped person who is a resident of the  
13 state at the time of application and who qualifies for a license under

14 (1) the Randolph-Sheppard Act (20 U.S.C. sec. 107-107f); or  
15 (2) regulations adopted by the agency providing for licensing  
16 of blind persons or severely handicapped persons.

17 (b) A license issued under this section does not expire. However,  
18 a license may be revoked if the agency finds that the licensee is not  
19 operating the facility in accordance with regulations adopted by the  
20 agency.

21 Sec. 23.15.134. ACTIVE PARTICIPATION BY SEVERELY HANDICAPPED  
22 LICENSEES. The agency shall adopt regulations that insure the oppor-  
23 tunity for active participation by a severely handicapped licensee in  
24 the administration of vending facilities operated by severely handi-  
25 capped licensees. The opportunity for active participation provided  
26 under this section shall be at least as extensive as the opportunity for  
27 active participation provided for a blind licensee under AS 23.15.135.

28 Sec. 23.15.135. COMMITTEE OF BLIND VENDORS. (a) The Committee of  
29 Blind Vendors consisting of all blind licensees is established. The

1 agency shall conduct a biennial election of a president, vice-president,  
2 secretary, and treasurer of the committee and may conduct elections to  
3 fill vacancies in office at any time.

4 (b) The commissioner of education shall assure active participa-  
5 tion by the Committee of Blind Vendors in administrative, policy, and  
6 program development decisions concerning vending facilities operated by  
7 blind licensees. The agency shall, with active participation by the  
8 Committee of Blind Vendors,

9 (1) adopt regulations providing for the licensing of blind  
10 persons for the operation of vending facilities on public property;

11 (2) consider and respond to grievances of blind licensees;

12 (3) develop and administer a statewide system for the trans-  
13 fer and promotion of blind licensees;

14 (4) develop training and retraining programs for blind licen-  
15 sees and for blind persons interested in obtaining a license to operate  
16 a vending facility;

17 (5) organize meetings and conferences for blind licensees;

18 (6) adopt regulations necessary to assure that vending facili-  
19 ties operated by blind licensees are administered by the agency in a  
20 substantially equivalent manner whether a vending facility is located on  
21 state or federal property;

22 (7) designate public property as appropriate for the location  
23 of a vending facility operated by a blind licensee.

24 (c) To insure the opportunity for active participation in decisions  
25 that affect the administration of vending facilities operated by blind  
26 licensees the agency shall, before each meeting of the Committee of  
27 Blind Vendors, provide the committee with written information on matters  
28 to be considered. The agency shall provide the committee with reasons  
29 in writing for decisions and actions of the agency that do not conform

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1 to recommendations submitted by the committee.

3 (b) A blind person or severely handicapped person aggrieved by a  
4 decision or action of the agency under AS 23.15.133 - 23.15.135 shall  
5 receive a hearing on request in accordance with the Administrative

7 a complaint in accordance with 20 U.S.C. sec. 107d-1 for arbitration of  
8 a grievance.
