Providing for the management of state-owned land in the Haines area; establishing the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve and the Haines State Forest Resource Management Area; and providing for an effective date.

* Section 1. AS 41.20 is amended by adding new sections to read:

ARTICLE 16. ALASKA CHILKAT BALD EAGLE PRESERVE.

Sec. 41.20.506. DECLARATION OF PURPOSE. (a) The purpose of AS 41.20.506 - 41.20.525 is to establish the state-owned land and water described in AS 41.20.507(k) as the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve as part of the state park system. The primary purpose for establishing the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is to protect and perpetuate the Chilkat bald eagles and their essential habitats within the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve in recognition of their statewide, nationally, and internationally significant values in perpetuity.

(b) The Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is also established to

(1) protect and sustain the natural salmon spawning and rearing areas of the Chilkat River and Chilkoot River systems within the preserve in perpetuity;

(2) provide continued opportunities for research, study and enjoyment of bald eagles and other wildlife;

(3) ensure to the maximum extent practicable water quality and necessary water quantity under applicable laws;

(4) provide for other public uses consistent with the primary

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1 purpose for which the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is established;
2 and

3 (5) provide an opportunity for the continued traditional and
4 natural resource based lifestyle of the people living in the general
5 areas described in AS 41.20.507(k), consistent with the other purposes
6 of AS 41.20.506(a) and this subsection.

7 (c) It is the intent of the legislature in enacting AS 41.20.506 -
8 41.20.525 to provide sufficient protection for the purposes for which
9 the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is established. Accordingly, the
10 establishment of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve and the Haines
11 State Forest Resource Management Area (AS 41.15.500 - 41.15.520) is
12 determined to represent a proper balance between the reservation of
13 state public domain land and water for bald eagle preserve purposes and
14 state public domain land and water more appropriate for multiple use.
15 Therefore, the legislature determines that there is no need for legisla-
16 tion expanding or contracting the boundary of the Alaska Chilkat Bald
17 Eagle Preserve in the future; the legislature further determines that
18 study by a state agency of the expansion or contracting of the boundary
19 of the preserve shall be conducted under AS 41.20.507(j).

20 (d) Inasmuch as the area described in AS 41.20.507(k) exceeds 640
21 acres, AS 41.20.506 - 41.20.525 are intended to close the area to mul-
22 tiple use in conformity with AS 38.05.300 and the land is dedicated as a
23 special purpose site under art. VIII, sec. 7 of the state constitution.

24 Sec. 41.20.507. ESTABLISHMENT AND MANAGEMENT. (a) Subject to
25 valid existing rights, the land and water presently owned by the state
26 and all land and water acquired in the future by the state lying within
27 the boundaries described in (k) of this section are designated the
28 Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve and assigned to the Department of
29 Natural Resources for control, development, and maintenance.

1 (b) Private land, approved or pending Native allotments, pending
2 and approved land selections made by the Haines Borough under state law
3 on the effective date of this Act, University of Alaska grant land not
4 located within the Chilkat River Critical Habitat Area established by
5 AS 16.20.230(8), and existing transportation and utility corridors
6 located partially or completely within the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle
7 Preserve are excluded from the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve. The
8 commissioner of natural resources may not acquire private land or Univer-
9 sity of Alaska grant land located partially or completely within the
10 Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve by eminent domain for any purpose.

11 (c) Approved or pending Native allotments located partially or
12 completely within the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve are not ad-
13 versely affected by the establishment of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle
14 Preserve and all approved allotments and all pending allotments located
15 partially or completely within the preserve shall be treated as private
16 land.

17 (d) The Department of Fish and Game is responsible for the manage-
18 ment of fish and game resources in the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Pre-
19 serve

20 (1) under applicable law and consistent with the purposes of
21 AS 41.20.506 - 41.20.525;

22 (2) subject to the authority of the Secretary of the Interior
23 to permit the taking of bald eagles for the religious purposes of an
24 Indian tribe under sec. 2 of the Bald Eagle Protection Act, 16 U.S.C.
25 sec. 668a.

26 (e) The Department of Natural Resources shall consult with the
27 Department of Fish and Game, the United States Fish and Wildlife Ser-
28 vice, a local governing body of a municipality, any local fish and game
29 advisory committees, and the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory

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1 Council established by AS 41.20.515 before adoption of reasonable regula-
2 tions governing public use and protection of the Alaska Chilkat Bald
3 Eagle Preserve. The Department of Fish and Game shall consult with the
4 Department of Natural Resources and the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle
5 Preserve Advisory Council in proposing regulations governing fish and
6 game management in the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve for adoption
7 by the Board of Fisheries or the Board of Game. The Department of Fish
8 and Game and the Department of Natural Resources shall cooperate with
9 the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in its administration of
10 federal law governing the conservation of bald eagles.

11 (f) The state land and water described in (k) of this section are
12 closed to mineral entry under AS 38.05.135 - 38.05.280, to commercial
13 harvest of timber, and to sale under state land disposal laws. The
14 commissioner of natural resources may lease the land described in (k) of
15 this section under AS 38.05.070 - 38.05.105 for a purpose consistent
16 with AS 41.20.506(a) and (b); a municipality may select land within the
17 Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve under law.

18 (g) Continued opportunities for traditional uses of the Alaska
19 Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve at levels and by methods and means that are
20 compatible with the protection of the bald eagle population are guaran-
21 teed. These historically compatible uses include but are not limited to
22 hunting, trapping, fishing, berry picking, other subsistence and recrea-
23 tional uses, operation of motorized vehicles, and the harvesting of
24 personal-use firewood. The level and method or means of traditional use
25 may continue subject to reasonable regulation unless the director of the
26 division of parks, Department of Natural Resources, after consultation
27 with the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council, makes a
28 finding that the level or method and means of use is causing significant
29 resource damage that is inconsistent with AS 41.20.506(a) and (b). The

1 director of the division of parks shall hold a public hearing in Haines
2 and Klukwan before restricting a traditional use permitted under this
3 section.

4 (h) If privately owned land, University of Alaska grant land, a
5 valid mining right, an existing mineral lease, a subsurface right on
6 private land, or other valid occupancy is surrounded by state land of
7 the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve or if privately owned land,
8 University of Alaska grant land, federal land, municipal land, or state
9 land not described in (k) of this section, a valid mining claim, subsur-
10 face right, or other valid occupancy on land not described in (k) of
11 this section does not have reasonable, timely, and economically feasible
12 access and egress by means other than crossing land designated as Alaska
13 Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve land in (k) of this section, the director of
14 the division of parks shall grant a private landowner, the University of
15 Alaska, a holder of a valid existing right to land, or a state agency,
16 municipality, or federal agency the rights necessary to assure reason-
17 able, timely, and economically feasible access and egress. A permittee
18 or licensee of an owner of land or the holder of a valid existing right
19 to land may use access and egress granted under this subsection. The
20 rights of access and egress granted under this subsection are subject to
21 reasonable regulation and stipulations established by the director of the
22 division of parks after consulting with the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle
23 Preserve Advisory Council to protect the purposes and values of the
24 Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve and to minimize adverse environmental
25 impacts in the preserve. As used in this subsection, "valid existing
26 right" includes but is not limited to a valid mining right, an existing
27 mineral right, and a subsurface right. The director of the division of
28 parks shall give favorable consideration to applications for utility
29 rights-of-way that are compatible with AS 41.20.506(a) and (b).

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1 (i) The director of the division of parks and the Alaska Chilkat
2 Bald Eagle Advisory Council established under AS 41.20.515, in written
3 consultation with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, the
4 Department of Fish and Game, the Chilkat Indian Village, the Chilkoot
5 Indian Association, and other appropriate groups, may use information
6 gained through cooperative resource studies in the development of the
7 management plan for the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve and in deci-
8 sions affecting the management and administration of the preserve. The
9 director of the division of parks and the advisory council shall investi-
10 gate the need for additional research to increase knowledge and under-
11 standing of the natural and cultural resources of the area and to enhance
12 the effective management of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve.

13 (j) An agency of the state may not participate or cooperate with a
14 federal or private study considering additions to or deletions from the
15 area of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve without giving 90 days
16 prior notice to the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council.
17 The director of the division of parks may waive the notice required by
18 this subsection on his determination in writing to the advisory council
19 that an emergency necessitates immediate study or a shorter period of
20 notice to the advisory council.

21 (k) Except for University of Alaska grant land, the land and water
22 owned by the state and all land and water acquired by the state in the
23 future lying within the following described parcels are designated as
24 the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve:

28 be adopted or revised without prior review by the Board of Forestry or
29 without a public hearing held in Haines and Klukwan.

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1 (b) The Department of Natural Resources shall periodically review
2 and revise the management plan adopted for the Haines State Forest
3 Resource Management Area under (a) of this section. The management plan
4 should be based on a current operational level inventory completed within
5 the last 10 years and revised as future inventory information becomes

7 (c) A copy of a management plan and any revision to it prepared by

23 * Sec. 4. The management plan for the Haines State Forest Resource Manage-
24 ment Area prepared by the Department of Natural Resources under AS 41.15.520
25 enacted in sec. 2 of this Act shall be adopted and implemented within two
26 years after the effective date of this Act. The Haines-Skagway Area Land Use
27 Plan adopted by the Department of Natural Resources in 1979 shall be used as
28 the basis for preparation of the initial management plan for the Haines State
29 Forest Resource Management Area. Before approval of the management plan
