Extending the life of the Regional Educational Attendance Area Budget Oversight Committee.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS on February 7, 1980, the president of the senate and the speaker of the house appointed a special Regional Educational Attendance Area (REAA) Budget Oversight Committee to provide accountability functions similar to those which municipalities exercise over their school districts; and

WHEREAS the legislature provided funding for the committee's operations during fiscal year 1981, fiscal year 1982, and fiscal year 1983; and

WHEREAS the committee held extensive hearings in the interim between the Eleventh and Twelfth Legislatures and between the First and Second Sessions of the Twelfth Legislature, during which it reviewed and scrutinized the regional educational attendance areas' financial management of educational funds; and

WHEREAS the committee submitted the reports of its activities in 1981 to the chairman of the house and senate Health, Education, and Social Services Committees and presented reports to the legislature in 1982 and 1983; and

WHEREAS the committee is continuing to develop better means of reviewing the operation of regional educational attendance areas as they set out to construct or operate educational facilities and programs;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the Regional Educational Attendance Area Budget Oversight Committee is authorized to continue to perform the assignments made to it by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house on February 7, 1980, through June 30, 1984; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education shall review and recommend action to the governor on the operating budget of each regional educational attendance area by August 15; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Regional Educational Attendance Area Budget Oversight Committee shall review the findings of the Department of Education.
