First Day

Pursuant to adjournment of the First Regular Session of the Fourteenth State Legislature on May 12, 1985 and in accordance with provisions of law and the Uniform Rules, the Senate was convened for the Second Regular Session of the Fourteenth State Legislature and was called to order by President Bennett at 11:05 a.m.

The roll showed nineteen members present. Senator Sackett was absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Most Reverend Michael Kenny, Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Juneau. Senator Abood moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

"Father,

You have given all peoples of our State one common origin, for from You we come and in You we live and move and have our being. It is surely Your will then that we live and work together as one family in Yourself. Fill the minds and hearts of the men and women of this Senate with the light of Your wisdom and the fire of Your love. Move them with the desire to ensure justice for all their brothers and sisters.

Senator Halford moved and asked unanimous consent that the Final Supplement of the First Session of the Fourteenth State Legislature, the first through thirtieth legislative days of the First Special Session of the Fourteenth State Legislature and Senate Supplement No. 41 be approved as certified. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Representative Larson and Representative Pearce advised the Senate that the House was ready to do business.

Dear Senator Bennett:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 23, of the Alaska Constitution, and in accordance with AS 24.08.210, I am transmitting an executive order relating to the Alaska

Royalty Oil and Gas Development Advisory Board. This order transfers the board from the Department of Commerce and Economic Development to the Department of Natural Resources.

In 1974, in response to the concern that the sale of royalty oil and gas should be made with substantial public involvement, the board was established within the Department of Natural Resources as the mechanism for providing that public review. At that time, the board was given significant controls over the discretion of the commissioner of natural resources to dispose of the state's royalty oil and gas, including the power to veto proposed contracts.

In 1980, the royalty statutes were amended. Partly because of friction between the board and the commissioner of natural resources, the board was transferred to the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, and its powers were substantially reduced. Its primary role since the 1980 amendments has been to hold public hearings on, evaluate, and advise the commissioner of natural resources and the legislature regarding proposed dispositions of the state's royalty.

In 1984, in response to the need for fiscal belt tightening, funding for the board was eliminated from the FY 85 budget of the Department of Commerce and Economic Development.

Without funding, the board could no longer retain its full-time staff -- an executive director and secretary. In their absence, the Department of Natural Resources has provided the necessary money and staff support to enable the board to fulfill its statutory review functions. Because of this close working relationship between the board and the Department of Natural Resources, and because the board's primary responsibilities are most closely related to the functions of that department in disposing of the state's royalty, I am convinced that it would be in the best interests of efficient administration to transfer the board back to the Department of Natural Resources.

The transfer has the support of the commissioners of natural resources and commerce and economic development, and the royalty board's other members. In addition, transfer of the board from the Department of Commerce and Economic Development to the Department of Natural Resources was included in HB 366, introduced in the 1985 session by the House Special Committee on Oil and Gas.

Dear Senator Bennett:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 23, of the Alaska Constitution, and in accordance with AS 24.08.210, I am transmitting an executive order that transfers the fire-service training program from the Department of Education (DOE) to the Department of Public Safety (DPS). Sections 1 and 2 of this Order remove that function from DOE, and sec. 3 gives it to DPS.

This function was added to the statutes for the Department of Education by secs. 1 and 5, ch. 86, SLA 1979. It appears that the program would be more appropriately located in the Department of Public Safety, and the commissioners of both of those departments, as well as fire departments around the state, support the transfer. It is one of the recommendations of the Fire Prevention and Control Task Force, in its December 1984 report.

Under its general authority to administer grants, to contract with school districts, to promote vocational education, and to administer the state's education program (AS 14.07.020(13), 14.07.030, AS 14.35, and AS 44.27.020),

the Department of Education has handled grants for fire-service training. To assure that appropriate grant administration continues, this Order's proposed AS 18.70.020(4) includes a specific reference to grants.

In addition, an increment is included in the Governor's request for FY 87 to cover the program's short funding and fully implement this program. If the Governor's request is not passed, then the Department of Public Safety would have a fiscal impact."

Analysis from the Department of Education: "The positions and funds budgeted for the program were transferred to the Department of Public Safety for FY 86. The Fire Service Training budget is contained in Public Safety's budget for FY 87."
