Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 11:11 a.m.

The roll showed nineteen members present. Senator Sackett was excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Most Reverend Michael Kenny, Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Juneau. Senator Zharoff moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread in the journal. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Following his address, the Governor received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Representative Koponen and Senator Sturgulewski.
