Dear Senator Bennett:

My letter is provided to transmit to you and your colleagues in the State Senate copies of the Annual Report of the Office of the Ombudsman for FY 1985. The report is in two volumes, the smaller being a summary of the material set out in the more comprehensive report.

I want to take the opportunity to remind you and your fellow senators that "public" portions of the "OMBD" data base are available for your use in the Alaska Legislative

Computer System. The "OMBD" data base consists of all complaints closed since January 1, 1980. Alaska Law requires that the ombudsman maintain the confidentiality of the identity of complainants and witnesses; the closed case summaries to which you have access have been edited so that information that relates to a complainant's identity is deleted. Should the members or their staffs require assistance concerning use of the system, please contact my Juneau office.

You have appointed members of the Senate to serve with a like number of members of the House of Representatives as an Ombudsman Selection Committee, pursuant to AS 24.55.020. If I may be of assistance to the committee in providing general information about the office as the committee deliberates on a recommended appointment, please advise me.

Please convey to your colleagues my sincere appreciation for the Senate's vote of confidence in selecting me to the office in 1981 and for the courtesies extended to me by the Senate and its members during my term.
