Dear Mr. President:

Pursuant to the provisions of Alaska Statutes 43.08.035(c) as enacted by the passage of Chapter 127, SLA 1976, the Commissioner of Revenue is required to submit a report to the Legislature by the third Monday of each January setting out in detail the amount necessary to be appropriated from the General Fund for the payment of interest on revenue anticipation notes for the previous fiscal year, the amount anticipated during the current fiscal year, and an amount forecast for the next fiscal year.
