Twenty-second Day

Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 11:10 a.m.

The roll showed fourteen members present. Senator Zharoff was excused from a call of the Senate. Senators Coghill, Vic Fischer, Josephson, Rodey and Sackett were absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Right Reverend Archimandrite Innocent (Fryntzko) of St. Nicholas Russian Orthodox Church. Senator Halford moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
