Thirty-first Day

Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 11:10 a.m.

The roll showed fifteen members present. Senators Coghill, Vic Fischer, Zharoff and Sturgulewski were excused from a call of the Senate. Senator Sackett was absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Reverend Art Knight of the United Methodist Church of Douglas. Senator Eliason moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

"It must have looked like fun, God, to be a Senator when the money roared in like spindletop. It must have been exhilarating to contemplate all the good things which could be accomplished; the plans born of high ideals which could be brought to fruition. It must have been very difficult, at times, to remain calm and objective about the future.

But we have come to know, O God, that simply throwing money at them did not solve all of our problems, did not cause the really thorny issues to dry up and blow away. And now, even spindletop seems to be subsiding to something far less spectacular.

These Senators know full well, Lord, the challenges that lie before our state. They know that the lessened flow of money requires even more careful management than before if it is to be sufficient for our real needs, and if our dreams are not to be completely laid aside. So we ask now that their vision be sharpened, to see opportunities that might otherwise be missed. Endow them with a full measure of ingenuity, and a willingness to compromise when necessary. Above all, keep them caring, for each other, for the State of Alaska, and for You. With this, we have hope; without it, we have nothing.
