The corrected title on the Finance Committee Substitute offered on page 1858:

SB 302

and a majority do pass. The report was signed by Senator Faiks, Co-Chairman and concurred in by Senators Halford, Paul Fischer and Eliason. Senator Kerttula signed "no recommendation" and Senator Ferguson signed "no recommendation, basic capital needs are not met".

CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 28 (FIN) (2d title am) (re-eng) was referred to the Rules Committee.
