Fifty-first Day

Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 11:15 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senator Ferguson was excused from a call of the Senate. Senator Eliason was absent.

Letter of Intent

"It is the intent of the legislature that farmers affected under this legislation be limited solely to those individuals and entities not participating in any federal program which has the effect of keeping agricultural land out of production. It is further the intent of the legislature that contracts, leases, development plans or other state documents amended under this law prohibit joint participation in the provisions of this bill and federal non-production subsidies for the term of the lease, plan, contract or other agreement."

SENATE BILL NO. 349 was referred to the Rules Committee.

SB 368

## Letter of Intent

"It is the intent of the legislature that refinances permitted under this legislation meet the following conditions:

- (1) they must meet underwriting standards applicable at the time of the refinancing;
- (2) any refinancing loan must be based upon an appraisal that is current at the time of the refinancing; and
- (3) the loan to value ratio of the new loan cannot exceed standards acceptable to major national secondary lending programs, such as the Federal National Mortgage Association, Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation and the Federal Housing Administration."
