### JOINT SESSION IN THE HOUSE

Speaker Grussendorf called the House to order. In accordance with Uniform Rule No. 51 the gavel was turned over to President Bennett who called the Joint Session to order at 10:06 a.m.

Senator Halford moved and asked unanimous consent that the roll call of the Senate be waived and all members be shown as present. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Representative Clocksin moved and asked unanimous consent that the roll call of the House be waived and all members be shown as present. Without objection, it was so ordered.

President Bennett appointed Senator Kelly and Representative Frank to escort U. S. Senator Stevens to the Joint Session.

Senator Halford introduced Susan Covich, daughter of Senator Stevens.

The Honorable Ted Stevens was escorted to the rostrum and introduced by President Bennett.

U. S. Senator Stevens presented his address, which is in Senate-House Joint Supplement No. 19.

Following an extensive question and answer period, Senator Stevens received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Representative Frank and Senator Kelly.

Senator Halford moved and asked unanimous consent that the Joint Session adjourn. Without objection, the Joint Session adjourned at 11:05 a.m.

IN THE SENATE

President Bennett called the Senate to order at 11:19 a.m.

The roll showed seventeen members present. Senators Josephson, Sackett and Zharoff were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Joseph Filancia Jr., of the Assembly of God Church. Senator DeVries moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

"Our Father and our God, we rejoice today as we think of Your love and kindness to us. We praise Your name Lord, for You are the Great God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

Pursuant to your referral under AS 44.60.050 and AS 08.03.010, the Senate Committee on Health, Education and Social Services has had under review:

BOARD OF PHARMACY

BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS

As required by statute, a public hearing was held on review of these Boards. The committee considered the findings and recommendations of the Legislative Audit Division and has examined the proposed budget for the Boards.

After careful analysis, the committee is recommending that the Board of Pharmacy and Board of Dental Examiners be extended for another four year period. Legislation to extend the Boards has been introduced.

The report was signed by Senator Fahrenkamp, Chairman and Senators Sturgulewski, Josephson, DeVries and Paul Fischer.

SJR 44

The Judiciary Committee considered SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 44 (requesting the United States House of Representatives to approve the McClure-Volkmer Bill) and a majority of the committee recommended do pass. The report was signed by Senator Rodey, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Kelly and Ziegler. Senator Faiks signed "no recommendation".

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 44 was referred to the Rules Committee.

SB 319
