#### Sixty-first Day

Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 11:15 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senators Vic Fischer and Josephson were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor E. David Spencer of the Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church. Senator Kerttula moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
