Seventy-fourth Day

Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 11:14 a.m.

The roll showed fifteen members present. Senators Abood, Coghill, Vic Fischer, Rodey and Zharoff were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Most Reverend Michael Kenny, Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Juneau. Senator DeVries moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

"Father,

Jesus, Son though He was, learned obedience from what He suffered. Suffer He did and obedient He became even to death on the cross.

Suffering is so much a part of all our lives. We experience sickness and physical pain. We carry the heartbreak that comes from the ending of friendships and the dying of loved ones. To a greater or lesser degree, frequently or no, we know disappointment and disillusion, failure and frustration. Suffering is there.

May we learn obedience as well ...not a passive resignation that simply leads us to accept the inevitable, but a dynamic hope that moves us to trust Your wisdom, learn Your ways and enter wholeheartedly into cooperating with You. Give us such a desire to do Your will that we will pay any price, endure any hardship to advance Your kingdom. Finally, may our own experience of suffering and sorrow make us ever more compassionate toward one another and unite us ever more intimately with one another so we can share each other's burdens and ease each other's pain. That in itself is a profound expression of obedience to You.

The Finance Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 370 (aid to families with dependent children and to child support and enforcement; efd) and recommended do pass. The report was signed by Senator Faiks, Co-Chairman and concurred in by Senators Kerttula, Ferguson, Halford, Paul Fischer, Eliason and Sackett.

SENATE BILL NO. 370 was referred to the Rules Committee.

SB 428

The Transportation Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 428 (acquisition of rights-of-way by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities; efd) and a majority of the committee recommended it be replaced with

and do pass. The report was signed by Senator Coghill, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Josephson and Paul Fischer. Senators Faiks and Abood signed "no recommendation".

Fiscal note is zero.

Analysis from Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, Engineering and Operations Standards: "The Department of Transportation and Public Facilities has some concern regarding the language of both House Bill No. 600 and Senate Bill No. 428. We do not understand the intent of these bills in view of present Alaska Statutes 44.42.020 and 09.55. Our major concern is with the words: '...prepared rights-of-way...'. By statutes, acquisition would be limited to fair market value regardless of whether the right of way is 'prepared' or not.

These bills appear to have no measurable fiscal impact on the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities as any funding for the acquisition would be by legislative appropriation."

SENATE BILL NO. 428 was referred to the Finance Committee.
