Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President pro tempore Halford at 11:12 a.m.

The roll showed thirteen members present. Senators Abood, Bennett, Eliason, Fahrenkamp and Josephson were excused from a call of the Senate. Senators Ferguson and Sackett were absent.
