Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 10:43 a.m.

The roll showed sixteen members present. Senators Coghill, DeVries, Vic Fischer and Zharoff were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Captain Bradford Russell of the Salvation Army.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Senator Halford moved and asked unanimous consent that the journal for the ninety-fifth legislative day and Senate Supplement No. 68 be approved as certified by the Secretary. Without objection, it was so ordered.

HB 601

HOUSE BILL NO. 601 by the Rules Committee by request of the Governor, entitled:

"An Act abolishing inactive boards, councils, commissions, and centers."

was read the first time and referred to the State Affairs Committee and the Finance Committee.

HB 699

HOUSE BILL NO. 699 by the Finance Committee, entitled:

"An Act creating the Railbelt energy fund;
and providing for an effective date."

was read the first time and referred to the Finance Committee.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

SB 264

The Health, Education and Social Services Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 264 (unlawful conduct of minors; and amending Rule 24 of the Alaska Rules of Children's Procedure) and recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 264 (HESS), entitled:

"An Act relating to the waiver of children's court jurisdiction, and to the detention, fingerprinting, and sentencing of minors; and amending Rule 24 of the Alaska Rules of Children's Procedure."

Senator Fahrenkamp, Chairman and Senator Josephson signed "do not pass". Senators DeVries and Paul Fischer signed "do pass". Senator Sturgulewski signed "no recommendation".

SENATE BILL NO. 264 was referred to the Judiciary Committee.

SB 377

The Judiciary Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 377 (civil actions; amending Alaska Rules of Civil Procedure 11, 49, 52, 58, 68 and 82; efd) and recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 377 (JUD), entitled:

"An Act relating to civil actions; amending Alaska Rules of Civil Procedure 49, 52, 58, and 68; and providing for an effective date."

Senator Rodey, Chairman, signed "do pass". Senator Kelly signed "do pass if amended". Senator Halford signed "do not pass unless amended". Senators Ziegler and Faiks signed "no recommendation".

SB 377 cont'd

SENATE BILL NO. 377 was referred to the Finance Committee.

SB 467

The Community and Regional Affairs Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 467 (establishment or operation of campgrounds within certain municipalities) and recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 467 (C&RA), entitled:

"An Act relating to the operation of campgrounds."

and a majority do pass. The report was signed by Senator DeVries, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Sturgulewski, Vic Fischer and Coghill.

SB 470
