SCR 43

Message of May 2 was read, stating the House passed and returned

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 43 was referred to the Secretary for enrollment.

SB 457

Message of May 2 was read, stating the House passed CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 457 (HESS) with the Senate Letter of Intent and the following amendment:

Page 3, line 5: After "chiropractic" insert
"as defined in AS 08.20.220"

Page 3, line 6: After "healing" insert "but only to practice physical therapy as defined in AS 08.84.190(e)"

and so CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 457 (HESS) am H (State Physical Therapy Board; efd) was returned for consideration.

The bill was held for lack of a quorum.

"An Act allowing tax credits for contributions to educational institutions."

was read the first time and referred to the Health, Education and Social Services Committee and the Finance Committee.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

SJR 49

The Resources Committee considered SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 49 (Proposing amendments to the Constitution of the State of Alaska creating the Alaska research development endowment) and recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 49 (RES)

Senator Sturgulewski, Chairman and Senators Coghill and Fahrenkamp signed "do pass". Senators Eliason, Zharoff and Vic Fischer signed "no recommendation".

Fiscal note is the same as SENATE BILL NO. 485 and will be in Senate Supplement No. 76.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 49 was referred to the Finance Committee.

SJR 50

The Resources Committee considered SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 50 (incidental catch of high-value fish stocks within the United States exclusive economic zone) and recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 50 (RES)

and a majority do pass. The report was signed by Senator Sturgulewski, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Coghill, Eliason, Zharoff and Vic Fischer. Senator Fahrenkamp signed "no recommendation".

Fiscal note is zero.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 50 was referred to the Rules Committee.

SB 209

The Rules Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 209 (Alaska State Fire Commission; efd) and a majority of the committee recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 209 (RULES), entitled:

"An Act creating the Alaska State Fire Commission; and providing for an effective date."

and calendar May 5. The report was signed by Senator Kelly, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Coghill and Josephson.

SENATE BILL NO. 209 will be on the May 5 calendar.

SB 379

Fiscal note for CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 379 (FIN) (premium tax for domestic insurers; and identifying the tax years to which the Act applies) (page 2572) is zero.

Analysis from Senate Finance: "CSSB 379 (Finance) is revenue neutral."

SB 456

The Finance Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 456 (Board of Nursing Home Administrators; efd) and a majority of the committee recommended do pass and the Health, Education and Social Services Committee Letter of Intent be adopted. The report was signed by Senator Faiks, Co-Chairman and concurred in by Senators Kerttula, Paul Fischer, Ferguson and Sackett.

SENATE BILL NO. 456 was referred to the Rules Committee.

SB 467

The Resources Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 467 (establishment or operation of campgrounds within certain municipalities) and recommended the Community and Regional Affairs Committee Substitute be adopted. Senator Sturgulewski, Chairman and Senators Coghill and Vic Fischer signed "do pass". Senators Zharoff and Eliason signed "no recommendation".

SENATE BILL NO. 467 was referred to the Rules Committee.

SB 473

The Labor and Commerce Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 473 (extending the termination date of the Real Estate Commission; efd) and a majority of the committee recommended do pass. The report was signed by Senator Zharoff, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Ray and Eliason.

SENATE BILL NO. 473 was referred to the Finance Committee.

SB 485

The Resources Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 485 (Alaska research development endowment; efd) and recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 485 (RES)

Senator Sturgulewski, Chairman and Senators Coghill and Fahrenkamp signed "do pass". Senators Eliason, Zharoff and Vic Fischer signed "no recommendation".

HB 251

The Labor and Commerce Committee considered HOUSE BILL NO. 251 (extending the termination date of the Board of Veterinary Examiners; efd) and a majority of the committee recommended do pass. The report was signed by Senator Zharoff, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Ray and Eliason.

HB 305

The Labor and Commerce Committee considered CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 305 (FIN) (barbers, cosmetologists, and estheticians; efd) and recommended it be replaced with

entitled:

"An Act relating to barbers, hairdressers,
and cosmetologists; and providing for an
effective date."

Senator Zharoff, Chairman and Senator Ray signed "do pass".
Senator Eliason signed "no recommendation".

CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 305 (FIN) was referred to the Rules Committee.

HB 407

The Resources Committee considered CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 407 (RULES) am (use of, and certain reports and records concerning game animals) and recommended it be replaced with

Senator Sturgulewski, Chairman and Senators Coghill and Eliason signed "do pass". Senators Fahrenkamp, Zharoff and Vic Fischer signed "no recommendation".

CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 407 (RULES) am was referred to the Rules Committee.

HB 430

The Labor and Commerce Committee considered CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 430 (FIN) (regulating audiologists, hearing aid dealers and the dispensing of hearing aids) and recommended it be replaced with

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 430 (L&C)

and a majority do pass. The report was signed by Senator Zharoff, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Eliason and Ray.

CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 430 (FIN) was referred to the Finance Committee.

HB 635

The Resources Committee considered CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 635 (RES) (establishing the Willow Creek State Recreation Area; efd) and recommended it be replaced with

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 635 (RES)

and a majority do pass. The report was signed by Senator Sturgulewski, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Coghill, Eliason and Vic Fischer. Senator Zharoff signed "no recommendation".

Fiscal note is zero.

Analysis from Department of Natural Resources: "If there is a CIP appropriation for area improvements, there will be associated operating expenses."

CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 635 (RES) was referred to the Rules Committee.

SB 418

The Rules Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 418 (Alaska minerals commission) and a majority of the committee recommended calendar May 5. The report was signed by Senator Kelly, Chairman and concurred in by Senators Coghill, Bennett and Faiks.
