Pursuant to adjournment, the Senate was called to order by President Bennett at 11:06 a.m.

The roll showed seventeen members present. Senator Coghill was excused from a call of the Senate. Senator Ziegler was excused from the Senate, not subject to a call, after 7:00 p.m. today. Senator Sackett was absent on State business. Senator Vic Fischer was absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Reverend Jim Patton, Minister-at-large for the Presbyterian Church. Senator DeVries moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
