The transfer of testing to the Division of Occupational Licensing is the most logical since the Division currently keeps all the records for licensing.
3. Finally, the Board enforces the electrical code through coordination with the Department of Labor electrical inspectors and complaints filed with the Division of Occupational Licensing. The committees recommended the Board of Electrical Examiners be allowed to terminate on June 30, 1986.
