Memorandum from Rosemary Kimlinger, Enrolling Secretary, Legislative Affairs Agency "In accordance with Rule 43(a) of the Uniform Rules, I am reporting that the revisor of statutes has advised me that the floor amendments adopted by the Senate on April 28 were intended to exclude the Alaska Railroad from the operation of AS 39.52, enacted by this legislation. The amendments, however, failed to make all of the technical changes necessary to delete or change all reference to the railroad as required to fulfill the legislative intent.
