Encouraging the hiring of state residents for state employment.

---

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the rate of unemployment among residents of the state is one of the highest in the nation; and

WHEREAS resident unemployment can lead to substantial social ills in the community; and

WHEREAS the state is encouraging the federal government and private industry to employ state residents in preference to nonresidents for work performed in the state; and

WHEREAS the state should set an example for other employers to follow; and

WHEREAS the exempt service of the executive branch is designed for positions requiring the greatest degree of responsiveness to the policies and philosophies of the governor; and

WHEREAS the partially exempt service is designed for positions that involve principal responsibility for the determination of policy or the way in which policies are implemented or which involve responsibilities and duties of a type not susceptible to the ordinary recruiting and examining procedures; and

WHEREAS the state has more flexibility in hiring decisions for positions in the exempt and partially exempt services than for positions in the classified service;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the Governor to implement a policy of recruiting and hiring residents for positions with state government, especially positions in the exempt and partially exempt services of state

employment.
