Relating to the qualification requirements for school superintendents.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS the Senate recognizes and supports the commitment of the 55 state school districts to provide the best possible education for our students; and

WHEREAS the Senate recognizes that a key element to a quality education is the high standards that have been set for teachers and school administrators; and

WHEREAS the Senate especially notes that the job of a school superintendent is extremely diverse and requires an expertise in many areas including curriculum development, supervision of instruction, instructional leadership, bicultural concerns and human relations, school law, staff management and evaluation, school budgeting and finance, and community/school board relations; and

WHEREAS the Senate highly values the classroom teaching experience a school superintendent must currently have in order to be an instructional leader;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate expresses its support for the quality and statewide consistency demonstrated in the existing requirements for a school superintendent and urges the State Board of Education to continue its efforts to promote these high standards; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate expresses its opposition to any change in the current qualification and experience requirements for Alaska school superintendents.
