Establishing a special committee on resource development.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS the state's economic future will continue to depend heavily on its natural resources; and

WHEREAS the present economy of the state has been tied closely to state spending of revenue derived from oil; and

WHEREAS dependency on oil revenue has resulted in an unstable economic condition for the residents of the state; and

WHEREAS Alaska's other resources play important roles in stabilizing and diversifying the state's economy; and

WHEREAS these resources are worthy of promotion, development, and marketing; and

WHEREAS the state and municipal governments are interested in diversifying the state's economy and reducing the state's dependence on revenue derived solely from oil;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate that a Senate Special Committee on Resource Development is established to examine other resource-related industries in light of the potential for furthering and enhancing economic diversification; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the president of the Senate shall determine the number of members of the Special Committee on Resource Development and appoint the chair and members of the special committee; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Committee on Resource Development may meet during the session and during the interim

after the Second Session of the Fifteenth Legislature; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Committee on Resource Development report its finding to the president of the Senate by January 1, 1989; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Committee on Resource Development is terminated on the convening of the Sixteenth Legislature.
